

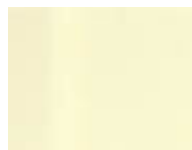
Color Guide: Painting an American Foursquare (1900-1930)



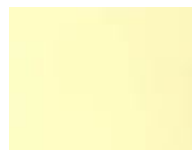
Soft colors such as white or ivory should be used on the American Foursquare's wood sashes, eaves, and trim. Soft earth tones such as browns, yellows, and greens should be used on siding and shingles.

*****Unpainted brick or stone should never be painted as it could drastically alter the home's original character and traps moisture inside walls.**

BRICK or STONE	Brick or stone should never be painted. If already painted, use colors identified above.

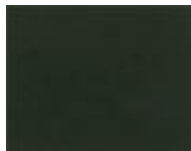

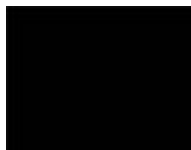
